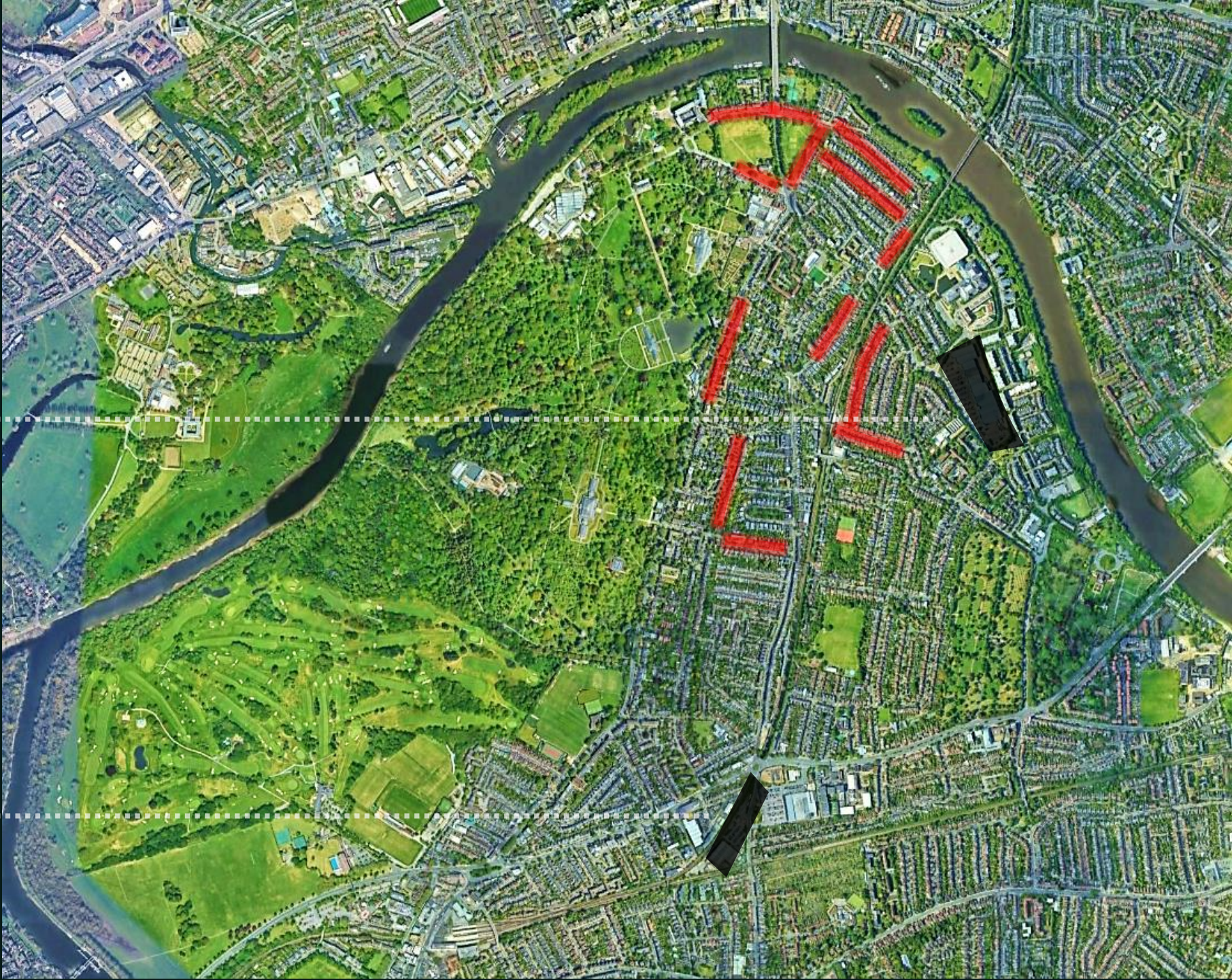

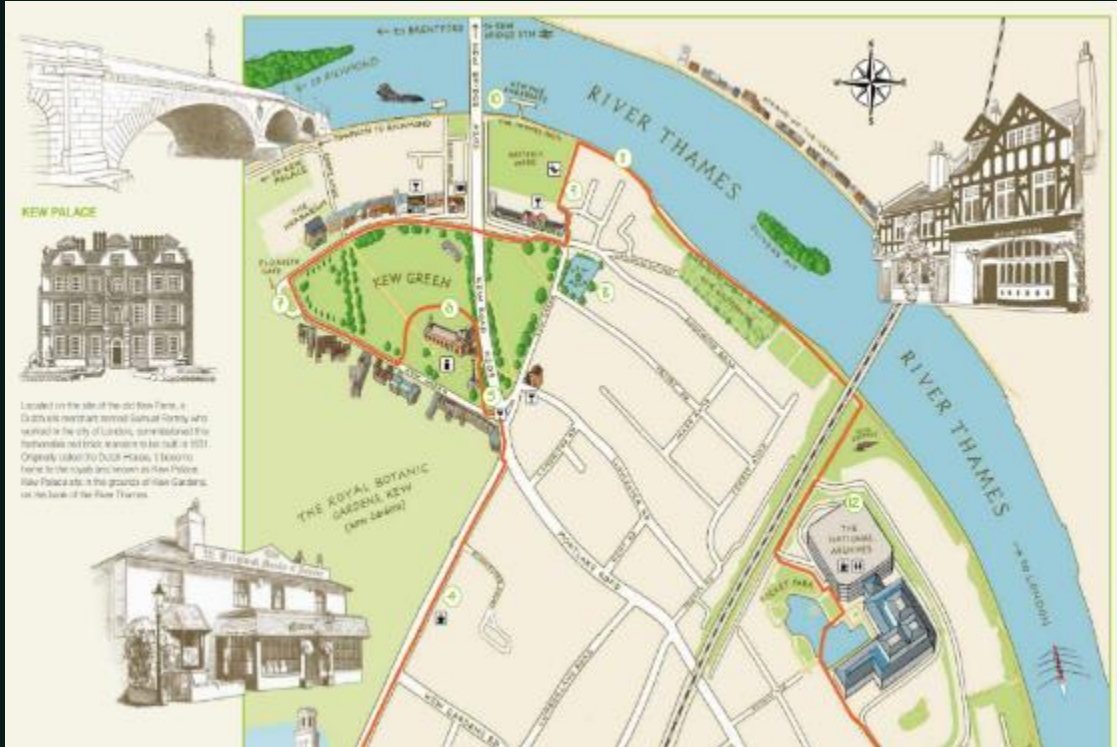

A CIRCULAR WALK AROUND KEW

- ### 1. KEW GARDENS STATION

The walk starts at Kew Gardens Station, which is a Grade II listed building. It was designed by architect John Lubbock and built in 1885. The station is a fine example of the Arts and Crafts style, with its brickwork and decorative details.
- ### 2. NEW VILLAGE

The New Village is a residential area built in the 1920s and 1930s. It was designed by architect Raymond Unwin and is a fine example of the Garden City movement. The houses are built in a mix of styles, from traditional to modernist.

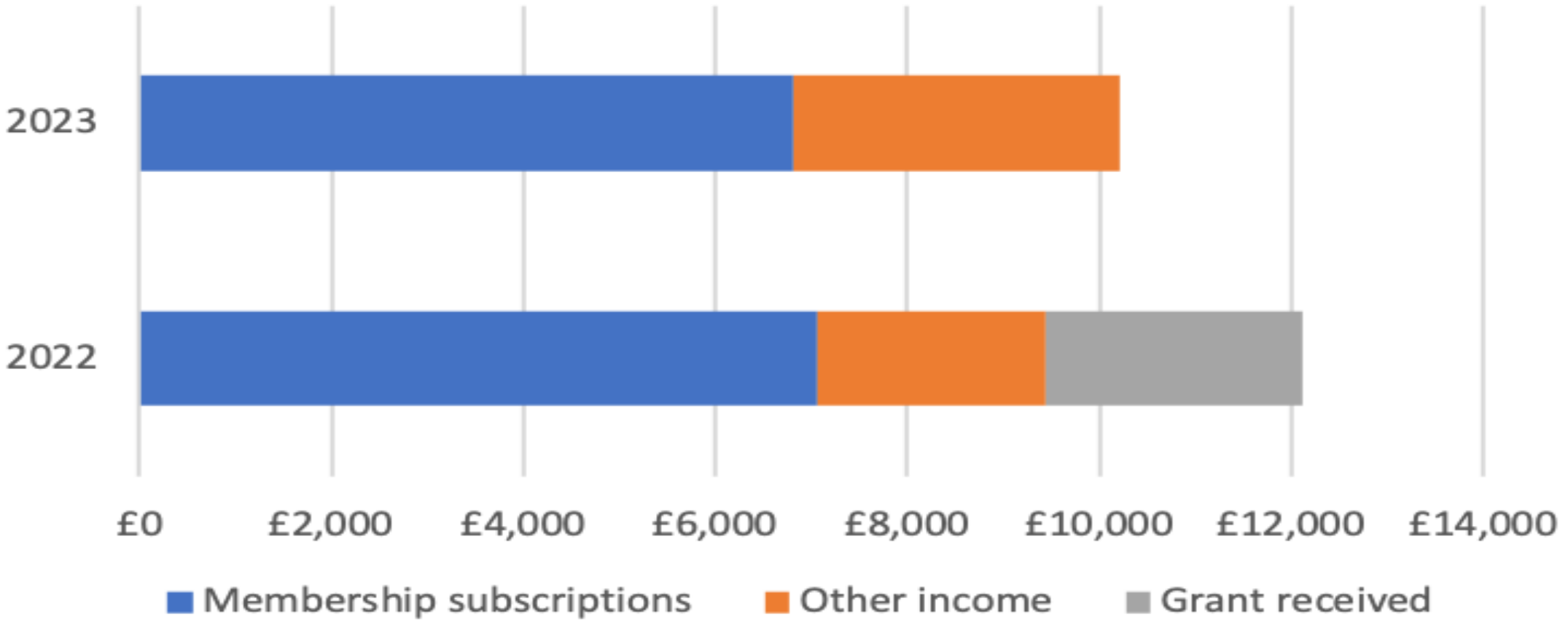

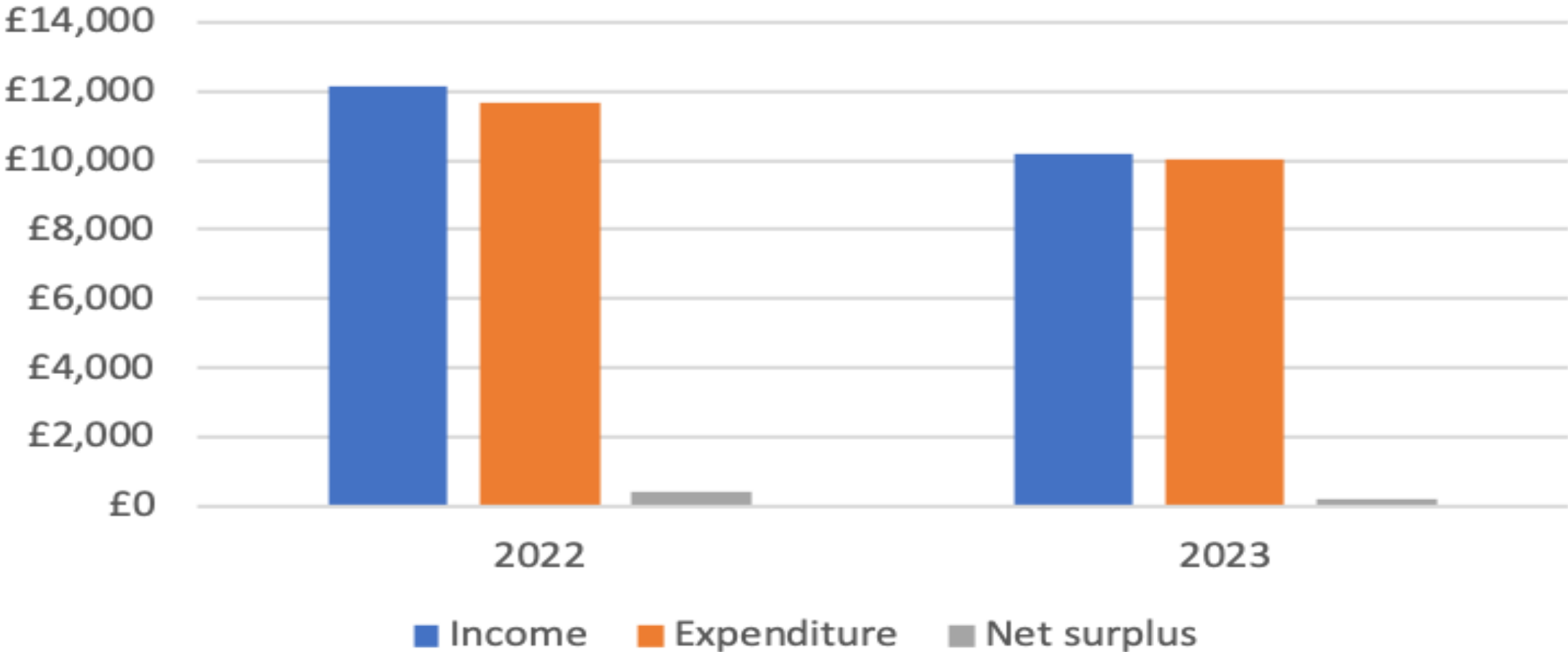
